

## **House Swap**

(conversation lesson)

level: pre-intermediate (A2) +

class: one to one

skills: speaking, listening, reading time: 60 min

## Warm-up

1. Ask your student a few questions relatedd to your today's topic: 'Where do you usually stay when you go on holiday? What's the most unusual place you've stayed in?'

- 2. Ask them if they've ever heard of house swap. If they have, ask them to give a definition. If not, give them worksheet 1 and see if they can make a definition using all the words. (correct answer: an arrangement where two families exchange houses for a holiday)
- 3. Ask: 'What do you think of the idea?'

## The Holiday

4. Watch this trailer from the movie The Holiday https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=VNLhaXujTbk and:

- a. if your student hasn't seen the movie, ask: 'What did Amanda and Iris do? Why did they do it? What went wrong?'
- b. if they have seen it, ask them for a much more complex introduction of the two main characters, based on the trailer and on what they remember from the movie, as well as a short review of the movie

## Swap!!!

- 5. Write a list of pros and cons of house swap and keep it for a later activity.
- 6. Ask: 'Do you know anyone who's tried house swap? How did it go? Where did they travel? Were they disappointed/excited/shocked/...? Would you try that yourself? Why/why not?'
- 7. Whether the answer to the previous question was yes or no, tell your student that now they are going to swap houses with someone! First of all, they have to choose where they want to go. Go to homeexchange.com and let them choose 2 or 3 places they like. If you are short of time or do not have Internet connection, you can use the ones in worksheet 2. Ask them to sum up the pros and cons of each place. Which one would be their first choice and why?
- 8. Now role-play the following situation: you are your student's flatmate and now that they've found a perfect place to swap, they have to persuade you to go for it, too! Be very reluctant and make your student fight for it. You can use the arguments you listed in point 5.

## Homework

9. Ask your student to write an ad for their house/flat to place on homeexchange.com. Remind them to make sure that the description sounds attractive enough to catch other home exchangers' eye!







This is your chance to stay in a home designed by David Seligman, who designed for the Hollywood movie Industry for 30 years.


A modern kitchen finished in boat wood and polished cement comes with all amenities.
